


Jonathma's contributions as an actor in the part of the vempire, Barnabas Collins, and also in the final storyline (1844 Parallal Time) as the cromatic lead, Brammell Collins, did much to keep the serial in the minds of viewers for years. Jonathan was born in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, and decided at an early age to become an actor. His fift role, at age 16, was in Sheridan's The Rivais, where he played a 60-year-old man. He received his Bachleior of Arts degreat McHaster University in Hamilton, and later tourned with repretory companies in Kent and Cornwall, then to London, where he entered the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts.

Returning to Canada he appeared with the Toronto Shakespeare Festival and graduated with honors from the Toronto Academy of Radio Arts then operated by Lorne Greene, the star of BONANZA.

Later he moved to the U.S. and entered Yale University, where he graduated with a M.F.A. (Directing degree). While at Yale he did the plays <u>King John</u>, Measure for Measure, Othello, <u>The Merchant of Venice</u>, and <u>Much Ado About Nothing</u>.

After Yale, he moved to New York City and did a number of plays, including The Golem, Henry IV, The Moon in the Yallow River, and, in 1982, he appeared in the American Shakespeare National Your with Katherine Hepburn. He also appeared in Don Carlos, The Storm, the Burning, Road Like a Dove, and The White Rose and The Red, to name a few. Just before joining DAKK SHADONS, he did the plays Poor Blots, The Critic, Two Gentleen from Verons, The Tempest, and starred in Richard III as Richard III. Prior to DAKK SHADONS he did another deytime serial, "Ne the Voir Jurns," as Pr. Meil Vaded, a man who could not cope with death. Later that same year he joined DAKK SHADONS with a three-week contract run, which, due to his popularity, extended to four

Jonathan Frid Biography continued

In 1970, while DARK SHADOUS was still on the air, he starred in the movie based on the series, House of Dark Shadoes, which included most of the cast. During DARK SHADOW's run he also did the plays Dial M for Murder as "Tony Mendice" and Wait Until Dark as "Mary Roag".

After the cancellation of DARK SMADOWS, he appeared in the play by ... T.S. Elliott, Murder in the Latherdrain, as "Meckett". In 1972 he returned to Canada to film another occult movie, originally titled Queen of Evil, in the starring role of "démond Blackstome", a writer of children's stories. The movie was later released in the U.S. under the title of Seizure, and suffered from one distribution.

In 1973 he appeared in the TV-movie, The Devils Daughter, with Belinda Montgement and doeph foot no. a "Mr. Monard". a must butter enslaved by a monagement of the state of th

For a time, Mr. Frid made his home in Guanojuato, Mexico, but now he resides in Manhattan, with a summer home in Canada.

In recent years Jonathan has been making appearances for conventions across the U.S. discussing his role on Dark Shadows. He is also doing a special presentation called THE EMESIS OF FUIL, to explore how his previous roles in theatre have shaped his approach and interpretation of the role of "Maranabac Collins" in DARK SWAHDOWS.

"Selzure" is an ambilious horror film made by a young New York director named Oliver Stone. Art. Stone, a graduate of the NTV Film School, went on to write A han For All Seasons with Robert Bolt. Mr. Oliver collaborated on the Selzure screenplay with Edward Mann. The cast of Selzure included a lot of New York Actors including Jonathan Frid as the haunted writer, Anne Macham as the soling beauty, Noger de Kovera es an old Count, Troy Domahum

Plot: Weekend guests begin to arrive at the country home of prominent fantasy writer, Edmund Blackstome (Lonnathan Frid). While working on his new book, Edmund has begun experiencing a sense of disquieting nightmares. He has drawn sketches, for the book, of the character; in his dress; Jackal the Glant Executioner, Spider the Dwarf and the beautiful Queen of Evil who is their mistraces.

Edmund appears to be peculiarly disturbed by the dreams which are hampering his progress with the book. That evening, the creations of Edmund's imagination come to life, revealing themselves as historical figures whose mission it is to play a game of survival with their human captives. To Edmund's bewilderment, the creatures pit his friends against one another in deadly connection. We is helpless to stoo it and eventually forced to participate.

"Seizure" is a Faustian tale of a man haunted at first in his dreams, then in reality by the creations of his own mind. Do you believe that it is possible to be literally frightened to death?

Note that the character "Spider the Dwarf" or "Louis the Cruel" is played with nasty humor by Herve Villechaize, who later became famous as "Tattoo", Richardo Montalban's sidekick on Fantasy Island.

Louis Edmonds ≈

Louis Edmonds, a consumate actor trained in the classics and experienced in opera, light opera and Broadway musicals, premiered in 1956 with DARK SURDON every first episode. He portrayed "Moper Collins", the stern and very proper younger brother or "Elizabeth Collins Stodader" (Slayde by Jose Bennett). The first time Louis remembers being on a real stage was in High School when he was cast as one of the Three Kings in a navity play. "I always wanted to be an actor," he relates. Later, he says, "When I was a teenager I always wanted to play the villain in a cowboy citure."

Louis gree up in Baton Rouge, Louisians, the eldest of three children, on a sogar plantation where his Scottlish great-granfather had settled many years before. He attended Louisians State University two years after high school and gathered some early experience in a little stock company in Bilox, Hississippi. He then volunteered for the Navy Air Corps and began service as a student pilox. The Navy later sent his to Barvard to study communications.

After his Navy discharge he attended Carmegie Tach School of Drama and played in such classics as Chebov's The Three Sisters as "Westhina", Cat on a Not Tin Bood, as "Be'lck", Streetcar Named Desire as "Stanley" and many others, lies graduated with honors and moved on to New York City where he participated in the beginning of the pioneer TV dramatic programs such as Kraft, Armstrong, Robert Monogorer Presents and V.S. Gilbert Short—11 live, without a tele-


He accepted a national tour with Edward G. Robinson in Darkness at Moon, a stark drama about a former holshwick leader in a Soviet prison. Then he made his Broadway debut in Leonard Bernstein-Stephen Sondhein musical version of Voltaire's Candide with Barbara Cook. He played the San Diego Shakespeare Festival; "Oberon" in Missumer Hight's Dream, "Polizaness" in Winter's Tale, and Wanthoy!" in Anthony and Cleopatra with Jacquel line Brooks.

In the 60's he played with Dame Clady Cooper in Passage in India, Ernett in Lovey, a musical version of "The Importance of Being Ernest", and also did Man of Lublancha. In 1973 he did a summer tour of Who Killed Santa Claus?, and later, in 1977 he performed in Othervise Engaged with Dick Cavett. Also, that year he portrayed "Schimke" in the theatrical production of The Rapists with Christopher Reeve, and former DS cortstr. Nicheal Stroke

In 1980 Louis played off-Broadway in The Interview by Thom Thomas, playing opposite Levis Arit. In The Interview Louis played skillfully a selfish, cruel older famous writer living in retirement in Italy and full of eccentricities.

Louis currently plays Professor Langley Wallingford on All My Children. His television character was introduced as a phony professor and con man who tries cextract money out of people. He utilizately got 550,000 out of Phocobe, the leading lady (played by Ruth Warrick), and got her to marry him, thereby making him part of the Pine Valley elite.

Louis presently resides in a little New England-style farmhouse on Long Island across from a 300-year-old church and cemetary. I'd say that is approppe for the Collins family Patriarch. Don't you?



Ron Sproat -

Ron Sproat, along with Joe Caldwell, Gordon Russell, Art Wallace, Sam Hall, Violet Welles and Malcolm Marmorstein brought Dark Shadows alive with their pens and imaginations. Ron wrote for Dark Shadows for three and a half years (1966, 1967 & 1968 "present-day" sequences and the 1795 flashback sequence) bringing life, death, mystery, and the occult into the family of the Collines.

Ron is a graduate of Yale Drama School and his writing credits begin with the U.S. Steel hour, Theatre Guild, Emeral Motors Presents among others. Ron's other dayline drama credits besides Dark Shadows are; Secret Storm, Love of Life, Flame in the Wind, Newer Too Young, (head writer), Edge of Night, Love is a Hany Splendored Thing, Strange Paradise, Where the Heart is, and west greatily. Canifol.

He has taught at New York University and written a book <u>Nobody's Perfect</u> which was made into a musical performed at the Equity Library Theatre in New York in 1983

Donna Wandrey joined DARK SMADOWS in 1970 as a floating apparition gowned in diaphonous blue roaming the halls of Collimwood. Not a single word escaped her lips, ruly a lady of mystery. When she did begin to speak, her character, Roxanne Drew, became the object of Barnabas' affection and maintained her character into different itmelines (Parallel Time and the 1840 flashback). Her character, Roxanne, finally surcumbed to the fate of vampirism and was sealed in a coffin. supposedly, for eternity.

Donna's other daytime drama credits include Edge of Hight as "Allison Perry,"
Amother World, as "Magle Perrini", As the World Iurns as "Bmarbara Ryam" and
Nyan's Mope as "Op. Newyers". She has done many commercials for TV and print,

Robert Costello -

Robert Costello produced DARK SHADONS from the shows opening through the 1897 time sequence, with two other producers taking over during 1970 (Peter Miner) and entering the sequence of the

After DARK SHADOUS, Robert produced a Canadian daytime serial called Strange Paradise which closely resembled the Gothic premise that DARK SHADOUS simbodied. In the seventies, served as Director and Producer on several other Daytime Serials, such as The Secret Storn, One Life to Live, Another World and Ryan's Hope. Under his production both Another World and Ryan's Maps received Emperoperation and Paradise Storn Storn Company of the Comp

In 1975 Robert produced the 13-hour WNET Special <u>The Adams Chronicles</u> which won an Emmy nomination for the Most Outstanding Limited Drama Series of 1975-1976 and 1976-1977. In 1981 he served as Executive Producer for the RNC Daytime Serial <u>The Doctors</u>. Currently, Robert is Professor of Film & TV at New York University.

W.E. Dan Ross

N.E.D. Ross is one of the most prolific and successful writers of our time. He has published over 315 books, selling over 30,000,000 copies, including the bestsellers China Shaddaw, Jadde Princess, Delta Flame, and Moscou Miss. He uses various pseudonyms perhaps the best known of which is Clarisas Ross, under which name he has written countless Gothles and romantchistorical

As MARILYN ROSS, he created and continued the DARK SHADOWS series for Paperback Library, comprising more than 30 titles. Mr. Ross has also been published in quantity by Tower, Berkley, Popular Library, Warner Books and Ballantine. His novel Yenetian Nights will be the lead book for Jove.

Mr. Ross has also established his reputation elsewhere, and is listed in Who's Mno in Religion as a religious writer. His papers are being collected by Boston University. Mr. Ross says that without the help of his editor and wife, Marilyn, he could not have managed at all. He has written a half-dozen plays, notably "MyBORE GAME".

Before starting to write, Hr. Ross was an actor, trained at the Provincetown Theatre School in New York. In 1933, he won the best actor award at the Dominion Drama Festival. He's also had his own troupe of players that toured the Atlantic region. He later attended the University of Oklahoma to study writing, at age 44. He began publishing novels at age 48. Mr. Ross and his wife live in his native toom of St. John, New Brunswick, Canada.

The word vampire is apparently of Servian origins (wampir). First applied in Eastern Europe to bloodsucking spectres, modern scientific usage limits it to two main species of predatory bats found in South American and the property of the species of the service and the species of the service and the species of the service and the ser

Although the vampire legends chiefly prevailed among the Slavic races of Eastern Europe, a feature article in the February 1896 edition of The New York World detailed instances of vampirism in both worldly Rhode Island and more isolated hamlets of Vitorian New England.

The most famous of all vampires is DRACULA. The word DRACULA meant dragon or devil in the ancient Wallachian tongue. Today he has become part of the pantheon of twentieth century mythology, alongside Tarzan. Synorman and Sherlock Holmes.

Oracia has many powers. He can summon the dead, control the elements and frame form himself into a bat, wolf, a rodent or a trail of upper. He must rest by day in the soil in which he was brief, rising refer with, a rodent or a leight y upil. Like all vamples, Dracula casts melther a shadow nor a reflection in alass. This is because both are soirtual reflections of the soul, and a vamoire has not soul.

The Vampire in Literature - Although enjoying some success as Varney the Vampire among the weekly serials known as "penny dreadfull" the present bracula craise dates from the publication of from Stocker's gizzly waspire table in 1897. Since the appearance of Stoker's novel, variations on the theme have appeared in over 30 novels, 18 short stories, 45 horror movies and five television series. 

COLLINWOOD - - - - - - LYNDHURST, Tarrytown, New York

At the dedication of Lyndburst as a public whrime, former Covernor Nelson A. Rockefeller of New York said the manion is the "finest example of Gothic Revival in America. Anyone with a feeling for the past will find a visit to Lyndburst an orbilarrating experience, however, he may feel about cothic archit techture and Victorian taste. An anyone lacking a sons of the past may well acculre one here.

For DARK SHADOW's fans a tour of the estate is a tour into the past, but of a different kind than the one referred to by Rockefeller. DARK SHADOWS FESTIVAL begins the weekend of tribute to the DARK SHADOWS daytime series of the late 1960's by hosting a bus tour to Lyndhurst and the surrounding countryside.

The movie interpretations of the popular serial DARK SMADDOS were both set on the estate which stands on a magnificently landscaped slope overlooking the Madson River near Tarrytom, Rev Tork. The movies, <u>Novae of Park Shadow</u>, and Might of Dark Sadows I sent their own renditions of what this point molorans within the provided of the stands of the st

Lyndhurst is an impressive edifice of gray marble, resembling a baronial castle, or rather a gothic monastery, with towers, turrets, and trellises; minarets, mosaics, bay-windows, vaulted ribbed ceilings; archways, armories, and air-holes; peaked windows and planealed roofs.



Inside the mansion, the DARK SHADOWS FESTIVAL Lyndhurst tour will be given by the Historic Preservation Guide who will expound on the real history of the thirty-room Hudson Valley stone mansion.

On the grounds our FESTIVAL GUIDE: Joe Collins, will take members on a "COLLIN-WOOD" excursion seeing many locales where shooting of the DS

Also, close to the Lyndhurd; estate, is the "Old House" from House of Dark Shadows, called BECHMOUD, which is now, sadly, converted into condemisture.

History: Lyndhurst was originally planned in 1838 by Alexander Jackson Davis as a summer "villa" for General William Paulding and his son, Phillip. Paulding was a wealthy lawyer who married an heiress of the Rhinelander family who was richer than he was. In 1864-66 the second owner of the property, George Merritt, employed pavis' services in the same spirit, when he commissioned the architect to add a new wing to the original structure, also in the Gothic Revival style. It was Merritt who named the place Lyndhurst. Later in 1880 Jay Gould, one of the greatest of American "robber barons," purchased the house and, with similar respect for Davis' creation, made no significant alternations in its style or structure, although furnishings of various styles were introduced.

With the passage of time and changes of taste most of the finest buildings designed in the Gothic Revival style have long since disappeared - but thanks to the organization and enthusiasm of a Historic Preservation group "The Friends of Lyndhurst" one of America's outstanding Gothic Revival Mansions is being restored and repaired, and remains open to the public to enjoy for generations to come.
